YOUR DIFFERENT COURSE OPTIONS

Exeter College's wide range of adult courses can help you go further in your career or start a completely new one.

With courses ranging from entry to degree level qualifications, we can get you where you want to go with our TEF Gold and OFSTED Outstanding rated education and specialist lecturers who share your passions.

Whenever you come to us in life, and no matter what your current qualifications are, we can help get you on the path and into the career you want. Our courses focus on skills that can be applied directly to the workplace or further study, giving you the skills and knowledge to progress in your chosen area.

Technical and Professional Qualifications

We offer a range of funded qualifications designed to support adults in upskills and retrain into skilled employment in a variety of different industries, including construction, engineering, digital and healthcare. Our qualifications range from Level 1 to Level 4 and run on a part time basis, with options to study for 12 weeks to a full academic year. All courses blend classroom teaching with online content and resources. Exeter College boasts some of the best industry standard training facilities, including our new Digital and Data Centre and our adult training hub, the Future Skills Centre, we are very proud to be able to offer our adult learners access to exceptional training and industry recognized qualification to support their career progression. We also offer a range of commercial training to support learners and employers in developing the required skills, knowledge and qualifications they need.

Skills Bootcamps

As part of the government's Lifetime Skills Guarantee, Exeter College offers free, flexible courses of just 12-16 weeks to provide adults with high level digital and technical skills. Our popular Skills Bootcamps provide the opportunity to develop sector specific skills to progress in their careers and into a new job role. Our Digital Bootcamps offer a blend of teaching and learning, with fortnightly classroom and workshop events as well as ongoing online delivery and a dedicated coach to support you through the programme and your individual Professional Development Programme. Our Technical Bootcamps provide hands on practical training within our industry standard Technology and Construction centres, to build your skills portfolio and prepare you for entering the industry. All programmes provide support with preparation for employment, including information on job vacancies, application and interview preparation.

Essential Skills

We provide free essential qualifications for adult to support progress and development in the workplace, education and life. These qualifications range from pre-entry level right through to Level 2 and include the following:

Functional Skills: these teach you how to apply practical Maths and English skills to real-life and work based contexts.

Essential Digital Skills: these enable you to participate in and contribute to the digital world, GCSEs, with academic study in English, Math and Biology.

We also run ESOL courses (English for Speakers of Other Languages), which develop reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills in the English language, as well as knowledge of language. All of our Essential Skills courses are offered both in the daytime and evening classes on a part time basis and at our city centre site.

Access to Higher Education

These are one year full time courses which are taught and assessed through a combination of lectures, small group work, practical exercises, group discussions, seminars and tutorials.

The Access to Higher Education Diplomas are a well-established and a highly successful route into university level study for adult students who may lack formal entry qualifications, wish to pursue a change of career and/or need to develop confidence and practice in their study skills.

These diplomas can also improve your general education and are specifically designed to help you progress on to professional advanced training. The range of modules available allows you to access a wide variety of courses at university level such as nursing, social work, teaching and psychology.

Higher Education

Exeter College offers a suite of qualifications at university level. You may find the information below useful to understand the types of programmes available.

Higher National Certificates and Higher National Diplomas

These are programmes related to an area of work and are highly valued by employers. They are designed to give you the skills to put your knowledge to effective use in a particular job. You can use this as a qualification in its own right, or for entry to the second or third year of some degree programmes. A HNC is a Level 4 qualification and a HND is a Level 5 qualification.

Foundation Degrees (FdA, FdSc & FdEng)

Foundation degrees are qualifications in their own right at Level 4 and 5 (equivalent to the first 2 years of an undergraduate degree). Foundation degrees are university level qualifications, like other degrees, however these programmes are designed with a particular area of work in mind and with the help of employers from that sector. Typically, you will get the chance to undertake workbased or work-related learning, as well as classroom-based sessions, developing specialist and transferable skills.

Bachelor of Arts Ordinary Degree (BA Ord) and Bachelor of Science Honours (BSc Hons)


If you have a Level 5 qualification you can 'top up' on a final year to a full Level 6 undergraduate degree in a relevant subject. An Honours degree includes the completion of a dissertation.

We offer an opportunity to top up to a full Bachelor of Arts Ordinary Degree (BA Ord) in Business Management in partnership with the University of Exeter if you have successfully completed a Higher National Diploma (HND) or Foundation Degree (FdA) in a business or management related subject.

We offer a BSc (Hons) as a top up from a Foundation Degree in Health and Social Care, Public Services or Sports Therapy. Our other Foundation Degrees all offer 'top-up' progression routes with our partner universities.

Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE)

The PGCE is a one year, postgraduate course for degree holders and is a Level 7 qualification. It is an advanced but non-degree qualification which mainly focuses on developing your teaching skills with support from a subject specialist mentor to develop your subject expertise.




UNDERSTANDING DIFFERENT LEVELS OF STUDY

We appreciate the various types of courses available can be confusing so we have put a guide together to help you find the right path for you.

Our friendly Adult Advice Team are always very happy to help so please don't hesitate to contact us with your questions. In some instances you will be required to have certain qualifications, such as a C/4 in English,* but for others you might just need to have an interest in that subject. For individual entry requirements please check the course information on our website, email adultadvice@exe-coll.ac.uk or call 01392 400170.

* Please note, from 2017 a grade C is equivalent to a grade 4

FEES AND PAYMENT

Please note that fees are shown as correct at the time of print but may change. Fees are paid annually for courses lasting more than one year and those shown in this guide relate to the first year, unless otherwise stated.

There may be some additional items that you will need to bring to a course. This will be stated on the full course information on our web pages.

FUNDING YOUR FUTURE

Government funded courses

The UK government in September 2020 announced its Lifetime Skills Guarantee representing a long-term commitment to remove the age constraints and financial barriers for adults looking for their first Level 3 qualification so that they can access training to enable them to progress.

At Exeter College we want our learners to have full access to this funding and so have broken down some of the key areas and criteria for accessing funded courses to the following areas:

Those who do not have GCSE Maths, English and Digital Skills at grade C/4 or above

Anyone who does not already have GCSE grade C/4 or equivalent in English, Maths and/or a Digital Skills qualification can be fully funded to undertake a programme of study, with the aim of working towards or passing a GCSE equivalent. Meaning, if you don't already have GCSE Maths, you can complete that subject for free with Exeter College rather than the full cost of £729.00. Please see pages 69-71 for more information about these courses.

Low income earners (salary under £17,374.50 per year)

For our Level 2 and below courses, these will be funded for anyone with a low income wage. This threshold is calculated before tax and is based on how much one person would earn working 37.5 hours a week on National Minimum wage. This funding can really help learners take the first steps on retraining for a new career.

Those aged 19+ and who do not currently have a full Level 2 qualification

Any learner who does not have a full Level 2 qualification (this is typically at least 5 GCSEs at grade C/4 or above) is eligible to complete any qualification up to their first full Level 2.

Those aged 19+ and who do not currently have a full Level 3 qualification

Any learner who does not have a full Level 3 qualification (for example, two full A Levels, Level 3 Diploma, or NVO) is eligible to complete any of our funded Level 3 qualifications.

Those who are unemployed

- If you are currently unemployed and in receipt of a benefit listed below, the Government will fund you to complete any of our funded courses up to and including Level 2.
- Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA), including those receiving National Insurance credits only.
- Employment and Support Allowance (ESA).
- Universal Credit (and your take-home pay as recorded on your Universal Credit statement (disregarding benefits) is less than £345 a month (when the learner is sole adult in their benefit claim) or £552 a month (when the learner has a joint benefit claim with their partner).
- Released on temporary licence, studying.

Those for whom English is not their first language.

If English is not your first language and you do not have a formal English qualification you will be eligible to complete a programme of work up to Level 2 English Language to help you improve your skills.

Those wanting to study a government loan funded course (Advanced Learner Loan)

Are you aged 19 or over and thinking about further education?

You may qualify for an Advanced Learner Loan. These loans help you to pay the fees charged by colleges and training organisations. Most learners aged 19 and over studying at Level 3 to 6 will qualify for these loans from the UK Government. It is easy to apply. Your household income is not taken into account and there is no credit check. You will not have to pay back anything until your income is over £27,295 a year.

To qualify you must be enrolling on a fundable course with Exeter College, be aged 19 or over on the first day of your course and have lived in the UK for the past three years.

How will I repay?

- You won't start paying back your loan until the April after you finish your course.
- Your monthly repayments will be based on your income, not on how much you borrowed.
- You'll only start making mandatory repayments when your income is more than £525 per week, £2,274 per month or £27,295 per year.
- You will only pay back 9% of any income above the threshold.
- If you are self-employed you will be responsible for making student loan repayments as part of your annual self-assessment tax return
- If you are employed, you will not need to do anything. Your employer will take your repayments directly off your salary as they do with tax and NI contributions.
- If you stop working, your repayments will stop and only start again when your income is more than the threshold.
- Any amount of loan not paid back after 30 years of repayment will be written off.

How do I start my loan application?

Before your course:

- 1. Decide what course you want to study.
- 2. Check your eligibility for an Advanced Learner Loan at www.gov.uk/advancedlearnerloan
- 3. Once you have applied we will send you a Learning and Funding Information letter. This will allow you to complete your application.
- 4. Register and apply online at www.gov.uk/advancedlearnerloan
- 5. Print off, sign and send your declaration letter to Student Finance England (SFE).
- **6.** Send any evidence required for proof to SFE.
- 7. SFE will send you a letter confirming your loan.

During your course:

- 1. Start your course with us.
- 2. We tell SFE you are attending, and they send us instalments of your loan.
- **3.** Interest on your loan starts from your first day on course.

After your course:

- 1. You can choose to set up payments to SFE whenever you like.
- 2. Mandatory payments will start the April after you finish/leave your course only whilst you're earning over the threshold (currently set at £27,295 per year, April 2021).
- 3. How much interest you are charged depends on your income.
- 4. Your loan will be cancelled 30 years after you were due to start repaying.
- **5.** Your loan may be considered paid if you complete an Access to HE Diploma and then go on to complete a degree.

Advanced Learner Loan Bursary

Learners who take out an Advanced Learner Loan have access to our Advanced Learner Loan Bursary. This is funding set aside for those learners who require extra financial help for study. Full information on the Advanced Learner Loan bursary can be found on pages 12-14.

Please note:

The fees for all students currently studying on a Higher Education programme at Exeter College will not change. This includes fees for students moving from an HNC to an HND programme or on to a BSc or BA Top Up programme at the college. These will remain at 2019/20 levels. Students moving to a Top Up programme at a partner university will be subject to their schedule of tuition fees.

We do not intend to apply any inflationary increase, if relevant, for subsequent years of study.

The college does not currently offer any waivers in respect of tuition fees.

Finance available

Student Finance England (SFE) can help to pay for university or college tuition fees as well as living costs for all of our Foundation Degrees, Higher National Certificates and Diplomas, Top

Up Degrees and teacher training programmes.

You may be eligible for further funding, for example if you are on a low income, are disabled or have children.

You will only start repaying what you borrow once you earn over a certain amount. The size of your monthly repayments will depend on



how much you earn, not what you owe.

You will be charged interest on the loan from the day you take it out. The terms and conditions can change.

How to apply

It is important to apply for student finance as soon as possible once applications open, to avoid any delay in funds being released after your enrolment. Student Finance England normally open applications for the following September around the end of February. You will need to keep checking the website and apply by visiting www.gov.uk/apply-online-for-student-finance

Please note for programmes accredited by a partner university but held at Exeter College on the university's behalf that Student Finance will need to be payable to the accrediting partner university.

You can use an online calculator to estimate what you will be entitled to, which will enable you to plan and budget accordingly. Find the calculator by visiting www.gov.uk/student-finance-calculator

Bursaries and financial support

There is additional financial support available, such as that provided by the Disabled Students' Allowance, Hardship Fund, Adult Loan Bursary Fund, Adult Dependant and Childcare Grants and the Care Leavers' Bursary. For more information see pages 12-14.

BURSARIES AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Bursaries provide additional financial support for learners to access should they need it. The college bursaries are split in to three main groups:

- 19+ Learner Support Fund (for those on courses up to and including Level 2)
- Advanced Learner Loan Bursary Fund (for those on any courses funded by an Advanced Learner Loan)
- Higher Education Bursary Fund (for any degree level programme)

The course you are on will dictate which bursary you will have access to, and some of the thresholds and eligibility criteria may vary for each one.

19+ Learner Support Fund and Advanced Learner Loan Bursary

Eligibility for 19+ Learner Support Fund

You will need to be:

- Aged 19 and over at the start of the academic year (on 31st August 2021).
- Enrolled on a further education course or traineeship.

Please note: this fund cannot be used if you are enrolled on an Apprenticeship.

Eligibility for Advanced Learner Loan Bursary

You will need to:

- Be aged 19 and over at the start of the academic year (on 31st August 2021).
- Have taken out an Advanced Learning Loan to cover your course fee.

How is household income assessed and what might I be eligible for?

The table below provides guidance on what a student might be eligible for following the assessment of household income. Please apply early as funds are limited, and financial support may not be offered in all circumstances.

How do I apply and what evidence do I need to provide to show my household income?

Please head to exe-coll.ac.uk/adults/support/ financial-support/ and start your online application for bursary support today. You will need to provide the following evidence:

- Universal credit statement (most recent and previous two statements)
- All pages of a tax credit award notice showing finalised income for 2021/22
- P60/Last 3 months or 12 weeks of pay slips
- Most recent tax return (if self-employed)
- Welfare benefits letter dated within the last 3 months
- Pension statement
- Details of income from all other sources e.g. shares, investments, savings, rental income

If you are applying for assistance with childcare costs you will be required to complete an additional form and provide further information. If you are aged under 20 please apply to the government's Care to Learn scheme (www.gov.uk/care-to-learn).

Higher Education Bursary Fund

The college offers the following two forms of financial support to eligible students:

Hardship Fund

This is a means-tested fund, which provides non-refundable grants of up to £1000 per annum for students at risk of withdrawing from their programme of study due to financial challenges.

Exeter College Care Leavers' Bursary

This is an annual, non means tested and non-refundable bursary of £500 per annum for 18-24-year-old care leavers to cover additional costs of HE study not covered by maintenance loans.

All of the above financial support can be applied for once an eligible student is enrolled and registered on their programme of study.

Disabled Students' Allowance

If you have a learning difficulty, sensory impairment or a physical disability and would like individual learning support, you can apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) via Student Finance England.

- Certain software
- Technology
- Learning support

Childcare Grants

You may be eligible for help with your childcare costs if you are a full time Higher Education student, have children under 15 (or under 17 if they have special educational needs).

The grant does not have to be paid back and is paid on top of your other student finance.

You must be eligible for student finance to apply for a Childcare Grant. For more information visit www.gov.uk/childcare-grant

Adult Dependants' Grant

If you're a full time student in higher education and an adult depends on you financially, you can apply for an Adult Dependants' Grant of up to £3,094 for the 2021 to 2022 academic year.

Members of the Armed Forces

If you're a member of the Armed Forces you may be eligible to claim funding for your course through the MoD's Enhanced Learning Credits Scheme (ELCS). For more details please visit www.enhancedlearningcredits.com/

Parents' Learning Allowance

Difficulty finding evidence for student finance assessments?

Applying for student finance can be a difficult task for some young adults, some still living at home, some estranged from parents and missing the required documents for proof of ID. This can be a stressful time and we understand this. Commercial Courses

The college offers several courses at a commercial cost. These courses are normally unique to a certain career path and are usually accredited.

For those courses costing over £150, payment plans are available for learners to pay for the course over a number of months as follows:*

- 50% of the course fees which must be paid at the time of enrolment
- Followed by two monthly Direct Debit payments of 25% per month.**

*Please note that you will need to visit one of our receptions to set up an instalment plan.

**Some courses have bespoke payment plans available. This will be indicated on the relevant course pages.

Instalments will not be offered to overseas students, companies or for amounts owed under £150. Please refer to our Course Fees Policy on our website for more details.

Businesses local to the college may wish to send a number of their employees on the same course. Our Adult Advisers can discuss your business training needs with you and design a bespoke training plan for fulfilling any needs found.

Alternatively, in some cases, employers will pay for individual learners to attend our courses as part of an employee's Continual Professional Development. For this we need a signed agreement from your employer to confirm how and when they will pay the course fees. The Employer Payment Authorisation Form can be found on the website at exe-coll.ac.uk/adults/apply

For those on other adult courses

- We will ask you about your previous exam access arrangements, any extra support you have had previously and what aspects of study you may find difficult. This will help us build a picture of you and your needs before you start your programme.
- You can receive one-to-one study skills support. This is offered outside of your college lessons and can help with using assistive technology, reading and research skills, spelling, time management, organisation, revision and exam techniques.

Your tutor will refer you for this if they feel you need it. Your tutor would set some targets for the areas with which you need support, and you would work on these for a set period. If you feel that you are struggling on your course it is best to talk to your tutor about this as soon as you can.

The Adult Advisers will also be able to take on concerns over finance, loans and course fees.







By Road: From the M5, J29 follow the signs for the city centre and then Exeter University campus and St David's train station. Please note that there is no available parking at city centre college sites. Charged parking is available in public car parks as shown on the map.

Devon and Exeter Construction Training Centre is easily reached from J30 of the M5.
Follow the signs to Sowton Industrial Estate, turn in to Moor Lane and left in to Kestrel Way.

The Technology Centre at Monkerton is reached from J29 of the M5. Turn right at the junction, right at the roundabout passing the Met Office on your left, across two roundabouts and the Technology Centre is on your right.

The Future Skills Centre is on the Exeter Airport Industrial Estate at Clyst Honiton, come off at junction 29 of the M5.

By Rail: Exeter St David's and Exeter Central stations are within walking distance of all city centre college sites. Exeter Central station is opposite Victoria House and the Centre for Creative Industries (CCI) buildings. Digby and Sowton train station is within walking distance of Devon and Exeter Construction Training Centre. Pinhoe train station is within walking distance of the Technology Centre.

By Bus: A number of buses stop directly outside the Hele Road campus. The Exeter College city centre sites are a 10 minute walk from the city bus station. There are also regular, local buses available to visit the Future Skills Centre, Construction Training Centre and Technology Centre please visit the Stagecoach bus website for details.

Parking: Parking is available on site at **Devon** and Exeter Construction Centre, Future Skills Centre and Technology Centre. There may be a charge for parking. All other sites have parking nearby.

Access to HE Diplomas

Our Access to HE Diplomas can be applied for through our website by clicking on the 'Apply' button apply.exe-coll.ac.uk

After completing a profile, you can choose the course you wish to study, complete your personal statement and send your application to us electronically. Our Admissions Team will get back to you as soon as possible with dates for interview, conditions of offer and next steps.

Application form

Some of our courses require an application form to be completed, signed and sent in. These forms can be picked up from any of our receptions, posted to you upon request or can be downloaded from our website.* To download the form from the website you will need to follow the 'Apply' link on your chosen course page, or go directly to exe-coll.ac.uk/ adults/apply

Interviews and Initial Assessments

As part of the application process we may ask you to come in for an informal interview with your course programme manager. This can be to gauge your current skills in the subject area (sometimes with an initial assessment), to know you a little better to tailor the course to your needs, or for compliance reasons.

Some of our courses require less information of your previous education and experience and do not require an application form or interview. You can enrol on one of these course by visiting one of our receptions where we will take

payment and give you more information on where and when your course will start. You can also enrol by downloading an enrolment form from the website exe-coll.ac.uk/adults/apply. You can then post or scan your form to the college.* Once we have your form you will then receive a call from the college in order to make payment for your course over the phone.

Please note that if you wish to pay by instalments or to claim a reduced fee for a course you will need to visit one of our receptions in person.

It is important that you apply and pay for your course at least one week before the course starts to ensure that you will have access to relevant college facilities and resources in your first week



AAT FOUNDATION CERTIFICATE IN ACCOUNTING - LEVEL 2

The purpose of the AAT Foundation Certificate in Accounting is to offer grounding in the core accounting knowledge and skills needed to progress either to employment or to further study. This qualification is suitable for young people who have just left school as well as for adults returning to work after a break or for anyone wishing to change career. The Foundation Certificate is open to those who are working and those who are not currently in employment. This qualification could also help someone who is already working in an entry level finance role to progress in their career by offering them development and formal recognition of their skills. Entry requirements are either Level 1 or above in Maths or English (tested through an initial assessment with us) or a distinction grade in our Level 1 progression test for those who complete our AAT Access Award in Bookkeeping. The qualification can lead to such roles as accounts administrator, accounts assistant, accounts payable clerk, purchase/sales ledger clerk, trainee accounting technician or trainee finance assistant.




AAT ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN ACCOUNTING - LEVEL 3

This AAT qualification is a competence-based qualification that gives you the relevant and practical skills to do a wide range of accounting and finance jobs. In this qualification you will master more complex accounting disciplines including financial processes, advanced bookkeeping, final accounts and ethical practices for accountants. This qualification is currently equivalent to 160 UCAS points and may support your application to university. It is expected that you will already hold the AAT Certificate in Accounting. However, it is possible someone may be eligible to begin at Level 3 depending upon accounting qualifications already held and work experience (an equivalent Level 2 qualification in accounting would be needed.) The Diploma in Accounting may lead to employment as an accounts assistant, accounts payable and expenses supervisor, accounts payable clerk, assistant accountant, audit trainee, bookkeeper, credit controller, finance assistant, payroll administrator, payroll supervisor, practice bookkeeper or tax assistant.

AAT PROFESSIONAL DIPLOMA IN ACCOUNTING - LEVEL 4

This course covers higher accounting tasks, including drafting financial statements, managing budgets and evaluating financial performance. On completion, students will be able to specialise in areas such as tax, auditing and credit control. The purpose of the Professional Diploma is to enhance the skills developed from the AAT Advanced Diploma in Accounting, enabling students to maximise opportunities in their current or new employment. This qualification is competencebased and gives you the relevant and practical skills to do a wide range of accounting and finance iobs. This qualification would enable you to progress on to ACA, ACCA or CIMA professional accounting qualifications or enable you to join at the second-year stage of a finance degree at many universities. It is expected that you will already hold the AAT Advanced Diploma in Accounting. However, it is possible someone may be eligible to begin at Level 4 depending upon accounting qualifications already held and work experience (an equivalent Level 3 qualification in accounting would be needed.) The Professional Diploma in Accounting may lead to employment such as assistant financial accountant, commercial analyst, cost accountant, fixed asset accountant, indirect tax manager, payments and billing manager, payroll manager, senior bookkeeper, senior finance officer, senior fund accountant, senior insolvency administrator. tax supervisor, VAT accountant, accounts payable and expenses supervisor.

ENGLISH AND MATHS PRE-GCSE AND GCSE COURSES

Exeter College offers a range of FREE English and Maths courses from Entry Level to Level 2. Pre-GCSE English and Maths courses enable students to build on the skills they already have and to progress to a higher level.

These Functional English and Maths qualifications are required by more and more employers and are built into Apprenticeships.

You will have an assessment and interview before you start the course to check your suitability and skill level to ensure that you are placed on the course that is best for you.

There are courses throughout the week in the morning, afternoon and evening, so you should be able to choose one at a time that suits you. For each of these courses full attendance is essential in order to progress.

Please note, these courses are designed for students who can communicate confidently and fluently in English and a fee applies to overseas students. A full ESOL Level 2 qualification or equivalent standard is required for all second language applicants.

When we receive your application form, you will be invited for an interview. For more information or to book an interview and assessment please collect an Adult Learning application form from a college reception or download one from exe-coll.ac.uk

Our adult English and Maths and Biology GCSE courses are intensive one year courses. For this reason, we allow learners to study a maximum of 2 GCSEs per year. See pages 62 for information on GCSE Biology.

PRE-GCSE ENGLISH (FUNCTIONAL SKILLS)

This course is excellent preparation for GCSE and is ideal for anyone needing to improve their spelling, punctuation, vocabulary and/or grammar. Topics are based around everyday situations such as travel, leisure, community life, and personal identity. The aim is to improve both reading and writing skills for working and personal life.

You will take two online exams – one in reading and one in writing and your speaking and listening skills will also be assessed by your teacher.

Applicants must be fluent speakers of English and bilingual learners should have achieved ESOL, Level 2 in reading and writing or be assessed as working at that level. There are no formal entry requirements for this course but you will have an assessment and interview prior to enrolling so that your teacher does not give you work that is too difficult as you begin.

GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE

GCSE English Language is a key qualification and is suitable both for native British learners who achieved a grade D in their GCSE at school (or a grade 3 if the GCSE was taken in past four years), and bilingual learners who have achieved ESOL Level 2 in reading and writing as well as speaking and listening. All learners are invited in for an assessment and interview prior to the course commencing.

This course is demanding and fast-paced. To study the GCSE you will need to be able to cope with the regular commitment of a once a week class and capable of considerable independent study. It will prepare you for two final exams.

GCSF MATHS

GCSE Maths is a key qualification and is suitable both for native British learners who achieved a grade D in their GCSE at school (or a Grade 3 if the GCSE was taken in the past two years) and bilingual learners who have achieved ESOL Level 2 in reading, speaking and listening.

This course is demanding and fast-paced and will prepare you for three final exams. You are expected to do a considerable amount of independent study. You need to be willing to work independently for three or four hours a week in addition to attending your class regularly. Your teachers will support and guide you and you will also need to make use of online resources such as Maths Watch in order to succeed in the three exams at the end of the year.

You will study topics such as algebra, probability, trigonometry, shape and space and will need to demonstrate that you can interpret data, solve equations and use a range of mathematical skills to solve problems.

For ineligible learners (those from outside the EU or those who have achieved a GCSE at grade C or grade 4 already) a fee of £729 applies.

ESOL SKILLS FOR LIFE (ENTRY LEVEL - LEVEL 2)

The ESOL Skills for Life Course is offered at 5 qualification levels, plus a beginner's class. ESOL qualifications are important stepping stones to other nationally recognised qualifications such as GCSE English and Maths. Attendance on an ESOL course is an important indicator to an employer that you are working on improving your English skills and the focus on communication in the classroom will give you extra confidence at work. Learners study twice a week with morning, afternoon and evening classes available so you can study at a time that fits with your life. There is an exam at the end of each term and a chance to gain a nationally recognised qualification which will enable you to progress to the next level. Learners in Term 1 take a Speaking & Listening exam, followed by Reading in Term 2 and Writing in Term 3. The focus each term is on communication skills with some focus on the exam near the end of the course. Learners usually remain in the same class for one year and then progress to the next level (if they pass all the exams at that level).

Please note: All learners take an assessment to decide which is the right level for them to join. Learners need to be able to complete the course and take the exam at the end, so the course is not suitable for someone who is here for a short time.

They are specifically designed to help you progress confidently on to professional advanced training. Our students often tell us they love the way the courses fit around their current lifestyle. Exeter College has been running the nationally recognised Access to Higher Education programme since 1987. We are looking for applicants with the following qualities:

- ✓ A high level of motivation to be an independent student with a willingness for self study.
- ✓ The commitment to studying a full time, challenging course.
- ✓ GCSE English and Maths at grade C* or above.**
- ✓ GCSE Science at grade C or above (for Science and Healthcare Diplomas).
- ✓ Evidence of recent study is desirable.
- ✓ A clear idea of the university level programmes that you wish to apply for.

*Please note, from 2017 a grade C in English and Maths equivalent is a grade 4.

** All learners on Access to HE Diplomas must hold or be working towards GCSE in English and Maths or a Level 2 qualification. Many universities require you to have English and Maths GCSE at grade C and above. Some courses will accept Functional Skills Level 2 Maths or English as an equivalent to GCSE.

Courses start in September and run for 35 weeks. The college has an expectation of a minimum 95% attendance in order for students to achieve their full potential.

You will usually spend up to 3 days per week in college - lessons are timetabled between the hours of 9am and 4.30pm, depending on the Diploma.

These courses will require a minimum of 20 hours independent study at home per week and a total of 12-14 hours of teaching.

Study will be a combination of lectures, small group work, practical exercises, group discussions, seminars and tutorials. You will collect evidence of your work and present it in a portfolio.

All Access students will also be enrolled on a supplementary IT course, at no extra cost. The ITQ qualification has been designed to enhance and polish IT skills for use in the real world and is vital for university and future careers.

Please note - this is a full time qualification that will require serious commitment. It is intended only for people with a clear plan to progress on to a specific course at university level. You will need the time and capacity to commit to full time study.

You should have written confirmation of this from the university attached to your Access application form. **See pages 69-71 for more.**



You will also study curriculum design and how to reflect on and develop your own practice.

HIGHER APPRENTICESHIPS

Higher Apprenticeships provide the opportunity to gain a qualification at Level 4 and above. Higher Apprenticeships typically take two years to complete, and involve part time study at a Exeter College.

How do they work?

Apprentices will complete assessments throughout the programme, which test both academic learning and occupational competence developed through on the job training. You will also be visited in the workplace to assess your range of skills and ensure your working practices meet minimum levels of competency against the national standard.

What are the benefits of Higher Apprenticeships?

- Higher Apprenticeships allow you to earn whilst you learn and progress into highly skilled occupations
- Higher Apprentices could earn £150,000 more on average over their lifetime compared to those with Level 3 vocational qualifications*
