YOUR ID CARD.

All staff and students at Exeter College are issued with an ID card to show that they are a member of the Exeter College community. We expect students to have their Exeter College ID with them at all times. This is important as you will need your ID card to access the Learning Resource Centres, to print and photocopy, for your exams, and to access many of the College buildings.

Lost your card?

You can head to any Learning Resource Centre to ask a staff member to print a new one for you. First replacement card is free but you will need to pay £2 for each re-print after that



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FRESHERS' DAYS -YOUR FIRST DAYS AT COLLEGE.

Your first two days at College are known as Freshers' Days. When you arrive, there will be lots of College staff to meet you and help you find your way around – just look for staff wearing their lanyards and some also wearing blue!

- Learn more about your course, your tutorial sessions and the wide range of support available to you with your studies and wellbeing

- Do some orientation activities to help you find your way around the buildings
- Get your individual College timetable so you know where to go on your first day of lessons (11 September).

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SIGNING INTO YOUR COLLEGE IT ACCOUNT AND RE-SETTING YOUR PASSWORD.

- Once you have your student ID card, you are officially enrolled!
- You will log in to your IT account for the first time with your tutor during induction.
- You should log in by using the first part of your email address (before the @) and the ExeColl password underneath your photo on your student ID card.



- You can then create your own password and set up Microsoft Authenticator.
- For further help logging in and getting started you can visit your nearest LRC.

TRAVELLING TO COLLEGE.


You are eligible for the Exeter College subsidised Travel Scheme if:

- You will be over 16 and under 19 on the 1 September
- You will be studying on a full time course
- You live more than 3 miles from Exeter College

You should have now either received your travel pass or applied for your travel pass. If you need a pass and have not yet applied, please head to the Travel webpage for more information and for contact details.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT.

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is available to help with the costs of coming to College. You can apply for financial support if you meet any of the following criteria:

- Your household income is £30,000 or below.
- You are in care, a care leaver or living independently.
- You received free school meals and think you might still be eligible.

YOUR WELLBEING.

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STUDENTS IN THEIR OWN WORDS – ADVICE FOR NEW STARTERS.

Most students get a little nervous about starting at a new College. There will be lots of new faces and the way you study will be a little different to how it was at GCSE. The trick is to remember that everyone is in the same boat as you. We've asked our current students for their tips to help you with the transition so you can enjoy College life as much as possible...

"Make new friends and have fun"

If you are a little on the shy side, don't worry. Remember, everyone is new! Get involved in tutor group activities and find the EXtra opportunities that suit you - these are a great way to meet other students and to enjoy time away from study.

"Make use of College facilities"

Check out Central Fitness (the College gym), enjoy the social spaces, do as much of your homework and study as possible while you're in College in one of our Learning Resource Centres or study spaces.

"Stay organised"

Loose bits of paper get lost, it's as simple as that! Organise a folder or use OneNote (available through your College account) to the best of your abilities, utilising different sections for different subject areas. This will help you to stay on top of your homework and assignments, make revision simpler, and reduce stress.

'Check your College email regularly!"

Make a habit of checking your College emails regularly so that you do not miss out on important announcements or opportunities.

"Balance your home and College life"

College can be very demanding, but this doesn't mean that it should control your life. Make time for the things you enjoy outside of study time too.

"You can only get out what you put in – so give it a 100%"

If you are not in class you cannot learn, and if you are not learning, you are simply not going to pass your course! Exeter College operates a 100% attendance policy to help you meet your targets and keep up to date with your work.



"Keep your personal details up to date"

If you change your mobile number or your parent/guardian changes their email address, for example, be sure to update that information on your eILP and on your Microsoft security info.

"Get your TOTUM discount card"
