The Department for Education (DFE) guidance states all schools and colleges use the internationally recognised Gatsby Benchmarks to develop a careers programme that increases the opportunities for all students to access a wide range of careers guidance and experiences of the workplace, personal guidance with a qualified careers advisor and engagement with training providers. Alongside traditional academic pathways we ensure that all students are aware of the benefits of apprenticeships, T- Levels, HTQs and other approved technical education qualifications and consider them alongside academic options when making decisions about their next steps.

#### The Matrix Standard

Exeter College is proud to hold and maintain the Matrix Accreditation Standard. The Matrix Standard is a DfE quality standard that helps organisations to assess, measure and improve the management and delivery of their information, advice and guidance services.

#### The Gatsby Benchmarks (taken from CDI)

The College is committed to the highest possible standards in Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) through a set of standards which define best practice.

The Career Development Institute (CDI) also provide a framework that looks at six areas. We regularly audit the curriculum to measure how we are evidencing these areas against the framework.

#### DFE Guidance Gatsby Benchmarks

The department expects all secondary schools and colleges to use the internationally recognised Gatsby Benchmarks to develop a careers programme that increases opportunities for students to access everything from experiences of the workplace and personal guidance with a career's adviser, to engagement with employers, colleges, training providers and universities. The benchmarks are non-statutory but support schools and colleges by providing a framework around which they can develop their careers programme in line with their legal requirements to provide independent careers to pupils throughout their secondary education (11 to 18-year-olds) and students aged up to 25 with an education, health and care plan. The benchmarks also support schools to fulfill their statutory duty to enable access of training providers to highlight to students what technical education and apprenticeships can offer.

# HOW EXETER COLLEGE EMBED CAREERS GUIDANCE IN THE LEARNER JOURNEY (Sixth Form)

#### 1. Advice starts at school

Advice and Guidance from our College Advice Team starts in schools and at College Open Events. They can discuss skills, interests and career aspirations to help students make the right course choice for them. Students are also given the opportunity to attend Discovery Days at the College to explore their course options.

#### 2. Apply now

Easy online application done via the College website. The website incorporates impartial careers advice via the Pathways tool, enabling students to explore career opportunities their chosen courses could lead on to. Our Open Events are the perfect way to find out more about life at Exeter College. Our Open Events are for school leavers, those looking for an Apprenticeship and adult learners interested in professional or degree level courses or leisure courses.

#### 3. Attend an interview

This gives learners the chance to discuss their chosen course or Apprenticeship with a subject specialist and their long-term ambitions. This ensures our teacher specialist team can ensure they are on the right course for their future aspirations. Advice and Guidance is available from our College Advice Team and careers team at these interviews.

#### 4. Enrol at College

GCSE exam results can have an impact on students' choices. Enrolment provides us with another opportunity to check that students are on the right course for them and go over any concerns about their course.

#### 5. Induction in to College life

Induction to the College includes a meet the tutor evening, an introduction to the careers team and ensuring learners know how and when to access additional support.

## **6. Supporting parents and guardians**

Information sessions are held for parents to provide guidance on the next steps once learners leave College. This includes advice on university applications, going on to an Apprenticeship, or into the world of work.

#### 7. Getting industry ready

At various points throughout their studies with us, learners will have the opportunity to complete work experience. Every learner will have the opportunity to engage with employers through a range of established links and benefit from a number of meaningful employer encounters.

## 8. Accessing careers information, advice and guidance

Students can access drop-in sessions,
1-1 appointments and support with UCAS
applications throughout the year. Delivered
through our extensive college personal
development tutorials and 1-1 tutoring and
group tutorials. Throughout the year various
events are held to provide careers inspiration
and offer further information on sectors and
industries. These include; progression fairs,
application and personal statement sessions,
UCAS sessions, employability skills, gap year
advice, student finance and much more.

#### 9. Results day

Our careers team are on hand to provide advice and guidance on results days, including, Level 2 results days and Level 3 results days and supporting learners through progression and next steps.

## **OUR CAREERS OFFER**

#### CIAG for 16-19 full time learners

All learners will receive an extensive collection of Essential Core Themes embedded in both the tutorial curriculum and learners core curriculum, including the 'Your College, Your Next Steps' focus.

All learners have access to impartial, unbiased information and guidance careers information and guidance from qualified advisers, either by self-referral via our online hub or by recommendation of personal tutor. Our IAG offer is tailored to individual need. We provide a visible, professional careers hub where learners can actively engage in career exploration. The Career Development Institute's framework is embedded within our Careers offer.



Careers are embedded in all faculty areas which highlights the relevance of subjects studied with future careers. Employability skills are developed through a range of tutorial sessions, workshops and 1-1 bookable sessions.

We are committed to ensuring all learners have access to meaningful employer encounters throughout their period of study with us.

#### CIAG for Internally Progressing Students on the Adult and Higher Education Provision at Exeter College

The Adult Learning Hub provides advice and guidance to all internal 16-19 year old students on our full range of Higher Technical Education, Adult Learning and Professional training courses offered at Exeter College. The Adult Learning Hub is available for bookable 1-1 IAG appointments, walk in appointments, email and telephone enquiries. Support can be given to applying students with UCAS application completion and Student Finance queries.

The Adult Advice team hosts information sharing events throughout the academic year, including the HE Internal Progression Event and HE and Adult Open Event and attend College wide events organised by wider college teams including the FE Open Evenings, UCAS Progression Event and STEMM Fair.

The Adult Advice team aims to ensure all prospective students have access to accurate and informative information, including progression routes and funding options, that will allow them to make an informed choice with their learning pathway.





## CIAG for access to Apprenticeship advice and guidance

We have a dedicated Apprenticeship and Employment Hub accessible on Queen Street in the city centre for drop in or pre-booked advice and guidance appointments. The team in the Apprenticeship and Employment Hub can support all students with general enquiries about apprenticeship pathways, including supporting students with suggesting employers in specific areas of interest, help with developing a CV, interview preparation and writing an application. The Apprenticeship team offer events throughout the year, including events during Apprenticeship Awareness Week and they also coordinate one of the largest Apprenticeship advice and guidance events in the South West annually, the Exeter College Apprenticeship EXPO in February. The College's Training and Recruitment Advisers have specialist Apprenticeship and industry-related knowledge and insight to support students and applicants in identifying the right pathway and employer for them.










## **KEY PROGRESSION ROUTES 2023**
